Jesse Takahashi Takes Over Vice-Chairmanship of Career Development Committee

Prestwich, former CSMFO Secretary and presently a budget analyst with Sunnyvale, was accepted at McGeorge School of Law in Sacramento, and will attend classes in the fall.

Paso Robles Voters Approve Tax Override

At the June 2nd election, 68.3% of the electorate voted in favor of Measure "D" which authorized the issuance of \$38 million in general obligation bonds (GO bonds). For many years, Paso Robles struggled with how to fund a number of projects that were identified by both the current and previous Councils as their highest priority. The construction in 1995 of a new \$7 million city hall/library facility eliminated two of the six identified priority projects from the list. However, it left the City's general fund in a precarious position without any resources for the remaining projects on the list: mainly the expansion of Niblick Bridge from two to four lanes with pedestrian and bikeway lanes, a \$12 million project; a new public safety center estimated at \$12.5 million; and unspecified airport infrastructure improvements.

Two new council members first publicly raised the possibility of asking the voters to approve a tax override, either property tax or sales tax. Staff began investigating the pros and cons of both options. Before the final determination, the city was contacted by the local school district regarding our willingness to participate with them in a ballot measure for electorate approval of either a tax override or issuance of GO bonds.

The district had two existing special property tax overrides adopted in 1977 - \$.18 within the high school district boundaries and \$.1775 within the elementary school district boundaries. The high school district is the larger of the two districts and wholly encompasses the elementary school

district. While their tax override does not expire until fiscal year 2002, the district was anxious to approach the voters to obtain matching funds from the State for new school construction. The district asked the city to participate based on the opinion that the dire need for citywide infrastructure improvements would sway public opinion sufficiently to pass a joint ballot measure.

The measure would request the issuance of GO bonds to be supported by the \$.18 per \$100 assessed valuation for the high school district and the issuance of GO bonds supported by \$.1775 per \$100 assessed valuation within the City boundaries. The tax rate to service the GO bonds would not become effective until fiscal year 2003 clearly supporting the premise that this wasn't a new tax simply a continuation of an existing tax. Additionally, property owners outside the city boundaries and within the elementary school district boundaries would experience a 50% reduction in the current tax rate.

Given the complexities in undertaking a special property tax override, both agencies concluded a general obligation bond was the way to go. It was also determined that a joint ballot measure was not legally permissible. Each agency would have to have separate ballot measures. However, the "grass roots' citizen committee" formed to garner electorate support and sway public opinion would work on both ballot measures as if they were one. As noted above, the electorate passed the city's Measure "D" for \$38 million in

GO bonds. However, the school district's Measure "C" failed by receiving only 59.2%. While a significant majority, it was not the super majority as required by law.

Although the city will not be eligible to receive property tax revenues until fiscal year 2003, the city will issue interest appreciation bonds to move forward immediately the voter authorized projects - expansion of Niblick Bridge, a new public safety center, airport industrial infrastructure improvements, new senior community center, new veterans center, and Cuesta College infrastructure improvements. The issuance of interest appreciation bonds and the council's self imposed limitations on tax rate and term length of the bonds sold will result in less than the \$38 million GO bond authorization unless citywide assessed valuation increases faster than projections.

City Banking Services, A Few Surprises

Recently the City of La Verne completed a Request For Proposals (RFP) review for city banking services. Our previous "traditional" banking service branch closed over one year ago and was replaced with an in-store branch at a local grocery store. In addition, we considered the interest rate on our compensating balances account too low and since the merchant window no longer existed. We elected to launch a formal RFP process to obtain a competive and merchant customer friendly service bank.

Seven packages were sent to local banks including our current bank. The RFP contained a number of conditions including employee service requirements such as free checking accounts for a limited period and the check paycheck cashing privileges for noncustomers. The city had a pre-proposal meeting to explain our conditions and to answer any questions. (Surprise No. 1) Four out of the seven banks sent a representative. This first meeting was reflective of more surprises to come.

On the day of reckoning when reports were due (Surprise No. 2), only three banks turned in proposals. The three banks included our existing bank, one negotiating with a property owner to open up a new branch in our town, and a third full service regional bank. We were faced with several perplexing issues. What happened to our competitive bid process? Were the conditions in our RFP too demanding for four banks not to submit?? In the end, one bank did meet all of our conditions and was therefore the clear

winner under our evaluation process. I've listed below some observations which may be helpful as you consider a banking services RFP.

- 1) It's not the same competitive market system out there now as it was five to ten years ago. Mergers and labor saving measures by banks have reduced some of our abilities to get the most for our city at the least cost.
- 2) Collateralization of city deposits as required by Government Code Section 53652 makes it difficult (i.e. not cost effective) for some of your smaller banks to submit proposals for city services. Three out of four institutions not bidding fell under this category.
- 3) Ask for as much as you can, expect not to get all that you hoped for. One bank not submitting a proposal indicated that the two employee service requirements were not part of their "standard" services so chose not to submit any proposal. Believe it or not, this was coming from the largest bank in our town!!
- 4) Use the pre-proposal meeting to clarify any unusual requests or conditions in your RFP. After initial review of the submitted proposals, send letters back to the banks to question them if they failed to provide a service. The bank may come back and offer what was originally asked for.
- 5) Review time took longer than expected. Contact the banks during this period with a status report or updated time schedule. They have
