### **President's Message**

Barbara Underwood, Director of Finance/Treasurer, City of Vista Happy Holiday Season To All!

**CAFR Update:** As most of you know by now, the CSMFO Board, acting upon a request from the membership, extended the deadline for submission of GASB 34 compliant CAFR's until December 31st. There was considerable discussion regarding this request and additional issues regarding the CAFR program were raised. The Board will be considering the CAFR issue in more detail in the near future to review the entire program and ensure that it is meeting the needs of our membership. If you have any thoughts regarding the CAFR program, please feel free to share them with me at your convenience.

### What's next with the State Budget?

Now that the election is over, the State will again be tackling the budget shortfall issue. How will this impact cities and districts? According to John Hill, of the Sacramento Bee Capitol Bureau, faced with a \$21 billion budget shortfall, Governor Davis called the Legislature into a rare special session in December to consider a package of cuts and other measures to cover \$5 billion of the growing gap. We all recognize that this has been and will continue to be a growing problem. A recent article in the New York Times by Bob Herbert noted that "watching the fiscal crises gripping cities and states across the U.S. is like watching a chain-reaction auto wreck in slow motion. I don't think the general public has a good sense yet of the pain that will result from the carnage."

Here in California (along with many other states) we wonder just when we will reach the point where the ability to deliver even the most essential services will come into question. Bob Herbert also stated "...during the boom years of the mid-to-late 90's, many states enacted permanent tax cuts that shut off revenue streams that are desperately needed now" and as we all know, no one wants to enact new taxes. Does this remind us of the VLF cut in California? In addition, no matter how much the budget gap is, tax increases are not popular and in fact, Jim Brulte, the California Republican leader has



### How to Conduct an E-Mail Survey

You probably knew that a significant amount of the information found on the CSMFO web site originated with simple email surveys. You may not know how easy it is to conduct your own survey.

### Here's how:

- Check the CSMFO Web Site First The results of previous surveys are posted on the web site. Also, the web site "Resource Room" contains many policy documents covering a broad range of topical areas. Use the "search" function on the web site for starters.
- Pose the Question Place your question topic as briefly as possible in the subject line of the email. This courtesy allows members to determine if the message is of interest to them without having to open it. Yes, Virginia, even CSMFO email gets deleted unread.
- Identify Yourself Be sure to include your name, organization, title, and telephone number in the body of the request.
- Edit Your Messages Sure, you've heard this before. Just remind yourself that instantaneous nature of hitting the "send" button creates many a ready-fire-aim blooper.
- Publishing Your Survey Results It is common for the requesting party to publish survey results to the entire membership. Be certain to re-state your survey question in the results email. Re-title your original subject line by adding "SUM-MARY [TOPIC] prior to transmission. This is another courtesy to members. It also makes the message easier to manipulate when the webmaster installs in on the web site.

Include also your name and the name of your organization in the body of your message or as part of your signature line. This helps others when they have additional questions regarding your survey. And, why not take a bow for your work?

Last, exercise caution with the file size for attachments. You're sending an enote to over 800 people, not all of whom enjoy high-speed internet connection. Large attachments can cause difficulties for them. In these cases, mail the documents directly to Frances Medema for posting at: medemaf@cacities.org.

 Posting to the Website As each survey is completed and results emailed via the group list serve to members, Frances Medema of the League of California Cities sees to the posting of the results on the CSMFO web site.

After the Fact Twice each month, the webmaster sends a "What's New" email to all CSMFO list serve members. This communication summarizes all surveys and resources posted that have been posted to the CSMFO website during the period.

CSMFO is proud to announce that the new Beginning Governmental Accounting Training is finally here. In past years CSMFO has identified a great need for providing training for those that are new to the government accounting arena or have to interact with the finance department but have no accounting background. It is almost like learning a new language and most of the courses available were either too lengthy and/ or too complicated. This one day training course will familiarize you with the bare necessities of what you need to know to understand that language. It is designed for those entering the field or those that work with finance and want a better understanding of some of the terms.

We were lucky to have the accounting firm of Caporicci and Larson donate their time and resources to write this manual for us. Steve Larson, senior partner, who has provided us with a student manual that can be used as a reference guide over and over again, took the lead on this project. They have also developed an instructor's manual with Powerpoint presentation that can easily be picked up by any volunteer instructor and taught with very little effort.

Working with Steve Larson to develop this course was Nasi Raissian, City of Sunnyvale. Thanks Nasi for all your time and talent devoted to making this project a reality.

stated that "I don't see any Republican votes" for higher taxes.

So that raises the issue, where do we go from here? How will cities and districts balance their budgets with diminishing resources and communities filled with voters who don't want to pay any additional taxes? The Financial Management Seminar in Monterey, will include a session regarding local government revenue diversification, fiscal balance/fiscal share and sustainability, reserve policies, and building financial trust and understanding in your community. This session will address some ways of tackling the problem of communicating important fiscal issues to the public, reserve levels in cities, and concepts of revenue diversity and sustainability. In addition to the session, White Papers were prepared on the subjects and are available on the CSMFO website. You many find them interesting reading, especially if you aren't able to attend the seminar and hear this provocative session.

### Interesting Information...

**League Policy Committees.** The League of California Cities has eight (8) policy committees. These committees address issues concerning cities and develop formal policy for the League, which is then acted upon by the League's professional staff. Over 400 elected and appointed officials participate as members on one of these eight committees.

Each division and functional department of the League (such as the Fiscal Officers Department) appoints one representative to each committee. In addition, several affiliate associations such as CSMFO have been given the privilege of designating one member as their representative on each of the eight committees.

# Housing, Community and Economic Development - Meetings of August 16 & October 2

SB910(Dunn) which proposed to shift land use authority over housing elements to the State, and to seize local gas taxes or VLF revenues as a method of enforcement has been defeated, at least, for now. (Senator Dunn has promised to bring it back next year.) Opposition to this bill was one of the Committee's top legislative priorities for the year.

In the legislative update, we briefly discussed the following bills and adopted neutral positions:
SB1717 (Machado) City Annexations: Municipal Islands
AB2370 (Thompson) Local Agency
Formation Annexation

We continue to be concerned about State proposals to set priorities for local jurisdictions that it may or may not follow itself. The Committee continues to oppose legislation that establishes such planning priorities for local jurisdictions before the State has demonstrated its ability to use and implement the same priorities. We briefly reviewed the 2002 Work Program. It was noted that although the Committee is charged with housing, community and economic development, the main emphasis this year has been on housing. The defeat of SB910 was considered a major accomplishment and one which has taken a great deal of time. Although it is likely to return we'll be regrouping and reassessing priorities as we look at our 2003 work plan. There appears to be interest in continuing the emphasis on revenue preservation and housing element reform.

Finally we brainstormed some ideas for legislation that we would like to discuss in more detail and possibly see introduced. These ir reform of the RHNA process, lement reform, local control, long infrastructure needs, requing state growth projects to be subject to CEQA and several others




