Why must the bringer of bad news be the one blamed for it?


Saying "no" isn't fun, and most people

2008 CSMFO Annual Conference

The CSMFO Annual Seminar Committee has begun the process of securing a site for the 2008 Annual Seminar and is looking for a Southern California city/chapter willing and capable of hosting the Annual Seminar. Requirements or desirable attributes for the host city/chapter include:

- Adequate hotel facilities for 400 rooms for two nights of the Seminar
- Meeting room facilities capable of accommodating up to 700 Seminar registrants
- Vendor facilities able to accommodate
 50 60 vendors for a two-day Vendor
 Faire
- Separate banquet facilities capable of seating 400 registrants for the Annual Award banquet
- Good transportation to the host City
- A willingness on the part of the host city/chapter to work hard in sponsoring the Annual Seminar

Believe it or not, hosting the Annual Seminar is a rewarding experience - in addition to a lot of hard work. The Annual Seminar is usually held near the end of February and could be held on Sunday through Tuesday, or Wednesday through Friday.
