
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The Challenge



The Challenge – Prior Years

- ERP systems solved the problem of disparate mainframe-based applications not integrating as needed
- Initially focused on core areas of accounting and payroll, many ERP systems have added additional areas of functionality through a modular approach
- Historically, ERP vendors could be grouped as Tier 1, 2, and 3



The Challenge – Industry Drivers



- As ERP systems became common-place, vendors increasingly acquired competing and complementary applications
- In recent years, the industry has seen an influx of best-of-breed "Point Solutions" that deliver specialized functionality
- Point Solutions generally are designed to be flexible in the enterprise applications they can integrate with


The Challenge – Business Drivers

- Most organizations are seeing increased demands for webenablement to serve citizens and a mobile workforce
- Other demands are revealing that some ERP systems do not provide corresponding functionality
- Many local government organizations are not in a position to change their enterprise applications due to resource constraints



What are point solutions?

Point Solutions Defined




- "Point Solution" refers to a best-ofbreed software application that delivers a focused area of functionality
- This focused area of functionality generally exceeds the capabilities of a corresponding module within an ERP system
- Point Solutions are intended to be compatible with a variety of ERP systems
- Vendors of Point Solutions may or may not have preferred partners among ERP vendors

Representative Scenario

A City in the southwest desired to supplement the CIS/UB module within their ERP system with a more functional online payment portal.

Key features and functionality were documented and compared among the potential Point Solutions and the ERP system's module

The contract with the Point Solution Vendor included provisions of what portions of the shared-software endstay they would "own"

The interface was initially a file transfer process and later transitioned to an API

More than a dozen parallels were run prior to go-live to test account updates being made and payments reflected
