#### Introduction

The California Society of Municipal Finance Officers (CSMFO) Board of Directors met via teleconference on Thursday, May 23, 2019. President Joan Michaels Aguilar convened the meeting and confirmed a quorum was in attendance at 2:03 p.m.

#### **Consent Calendar**

The Board addressed the consent calendar, which included April 2019 financials and minutes from the April 25, 2019 Board of Directors meeting. Sarah Erck will make the following corrections to the minutes; Misspellings of Castaneda, Reyna, Stephen and CSMFO.

Past President Margaret Moggia motioned to approve the minutes with the corrections. Jennifer Wakeman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Knowledge Base Demonstration**

Matt Pressey shared his screen to review the Knowledge Base Demo the Technology Committee developed.

#### **Probolsky Research Contract**

Kate Zawadzki reviewed the background of the current Probolsky contract which expires this year as well as the changes in the proposed contract. Probolsky would like to propose doing future focus groups at chapter meetings or other locations outside of the conference in order to get responses from a new group of people.

Richard Lee motioned to approve the recommendation of the committee. Stephen Parker seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Contract Amendment for Administrative Support for Annual Conference**

Ronnie Campbell reviewed the agreement with Harriet Commons and her responsibilities to the Program Committee. The amendment presented more accurately reflects the true scope which includes work (CPE tracking, presentation material gathering)

Past President Margaret Moggia motioned to approve the contract amendment as proposed and direct the Admin Committee to work with SMA to incorporate the not to exceed amount on the contract. Steve Heide seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Weekend Training Hotel Contract Approval**

Pam Arends King presented the Weekend Training contract.

Past President Margaret Moggia motioned to approve the proposed contract. Jennifer Wakeman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **2019 Conference Update**

Janet Salvetti presented the final 2019 Conference Budget vs. Actuals. The chart of accounts is going to be consolidated to make for a simpler budget in 2020. SMA Staff and Janet have plans to discuss. John Adams noted that he always found value in the detailed chart of accounts, so you always have the history on who is attending year to year. Executive Director Melissa Manchester will make sure this is taken into account.

#### **Committee Reports**

Administration

Kate Zawadzki led a discussion of the membership types modifications with regard to student members. The Admin Committee will close the loop.

#### Career Development

Pam Arends King reported on the call last week and provided an overview of scheduled courses to date. President Joan Michaels Aguilar brought up the question of podcasts and asked for an update on quick hits. Nothing regarding podcasts to report but Pam will work with Brad Farmer on adding to the quick hits, possibly one on the Knowledge Base Demo.

#### Communications

Marcus Pimentel reviewed the new format of the online magazine which went online on May 1, 2019. Kudos to SMA staff. May is the soft launch, the official launch will be June 3, 2019. A request for content will be going out soon. President Joan Michaels Aguilar encourages Chapter Chairs to find potential writers in their communities.

#### Membership

Grace Castaneda reported that the student landing page is now on the CSMFO website. Thanks to Amanda Smith at SMA and the committee it's looking good. The committee hopes to launch in time for annual conference registration and the student scholarship launch. Grace will share the link when it's ready.

#### **Professional Standards**

Jason Al Imam reported that five committee highlights have been published thus far and another is coming out next week. They are also working with the Communications Committee to push these out via the new magazine format.

#### Program

Ronnie Campbell reported that call for sessions is out, the committee is waiting on responses.

#### Recognition

Sara Roush reported that requests to present CAFR awards are coming in. Please let Sara know if you are interested/available in being a presenter. Sara also reported on the updates to Awards Force, the Innovation Award winners template/scoring is in process, and that a handbook for committee members has been distributed to the committee.

#### Technology

Matt Pressey reported that the committee is continuing to work on user experience via branded emails, knowledge base, etc...

#### **Chapter Roundtable**

Craig Boyer reminded folks that they will be having a chapter meeting in June. Stephen Parker noted that there will be League Updates for the next meeting.

#### **Director Roundtable**

Richard Lee reported on the progress of the CSMFO app development. The working group had a kickoff meeting on May 3, 2019 and have planned for weekly meetings every Friday. They are currently reviewing what content needs to be included and are hoping to move on to the next step in July. The end of the calendar year is the hope for a final product.

Carrie Corder reported that the recent Inland Empire chapter meeting was great.

Ernie Reyna reported that now that his budget has been approved, he'll have more time to attend chapter meetings. He hopes to get to Desert Mountain, San Gabriel and Los Angeles over the next few months.

Will Fuentes announced that he has a new job at City of Campbell. He is taking over for Jessie and thus has big shoes to fill. Their budget will go to the council in June and once that process is done, he hopes to get out to more chapter meetings as well.

#### **Officer Reports**

There was a wonderful turnout at the CSMFO reception at GFOA. They received 704 RSVPs, thankfully not all showed up because the venue only held 250. GFOA president had very kind words about CSMFO's conference.

Past President Margaret Moggia

There will be a Chapter Chairs call June 10<sup>th</sup>. Margaret will reach out to them for intel on pricing, structure, succession planning, etc. She noted that she has already invited lots of GFOA leadership to the upcoming CSMFO conference and that they're already looking forward to it.

President-Elect Steve Heide

Steve shared some insights on GFOAs efforts regarding student engagement. A scholarship winner shadowed him at the conference, which was a big success. Steve also had big thanks to Melissa Manchester and David Garrison for designing and manning the CSMFO booth at GFOA.

Steve also reported that the landing page for the 2020 conference is up with some basic info posted, more to come later. Right now, the committee is finalizing contracts with keynotes and discussion opportunities for additional training at the conference for no additional fees. The Host Committee will explore a registration fee increase and he looks forward to bringing more information to the board soon.

SUBJECT: Update on the June 2019 League of California Cities' Environmental Quality

Policy Committee Meeting

### **Background:**

The League of California Cities' June 2019 Policy Committee meetings began on Thursday, June 13, 2019. An overview of the state budget and issues briefing were provided in a group session, while the individual policy committee meetings were held separately. Highlights for both are included in this report.

The following topics were briefly discussed at the group state budget and key issues briefing:

- Governor's Budget Update
- Major Issues for 2019 Session
- Housing and Land Use
  - o Funding for housing tax credits and moderate-income housing production
  - Funding to address homelessness needs
  - o Short-term planning and infill infrastructure grants
  - o Budget trailer bill RHNA reforms and linking transportation funding to housing
  - Legislative proposals
  - Existing funding opportunities
  - o SB 330 Housing Crisis Act of 2019 (LLC opposes)
  - Next steps
- Governance, Transparency and Labor Relations
  - o Workers' Compensation Legislation
- Public Safety and Cannabis
  - o AB 392 Use of deadly force
  - o SB 320 Use of force
  - o Liability for utility-caused wildfires: inverse condemnation
  - o SB 901 Commission Report

- o League co-sponsors emergency management preparedness summit
- o Bills of interest
- Environmental Issues
- Transportation, Telecommunication and Public Works
- Revenue and Taxation

The following items were discussed at the Environmental Quality Policy Committee meeting:

- **Presentation:** A presentation was made by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) on the challenges California faces in solid waste and recycling and how cities can work together with the state to combat the coming challenges.
- **Presentation:** A presentation was made by California's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) on how they are helping communities prepare for, deal with, and recover from natural disasters.
- Community Choice Aggregation Policy: Based on the committee's previous action to adopt community choice aggregation policy in 2017, the committee considered similar changes to adopt CCA policies. The committee voted to approve and forward to the League Board for approval.
- Legislative Agenda: The was one action item and one item was pulled:
  - AB 56 (E. Garcia) Electricity: procurement by the California Alternative Energy and Advanced Transportation Financing Authority. The committee voted to oppose, which is now pending League Board review.
  - o AB 1583 (Eggman) The California Recycling Market Development Act (pulled)
- Legislative Update: Updates were provided on the following recently introduced and pending legislation.
  - o AB 217 (Garcia) Safe Drinking Water for All Act.
    - Ag. Fees, water tax, creates a trust
    - AB 755 (Holden) California tire fee: Stormwater Permit Compliance Fund.
      - Increased fee revamped from last year's proposal
  - AB 1080 (Gonzalez D) California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act
    - Would enact the California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act, which would establish the policy goal of the state that by 2030 manufacturers and retailers achieve a 75% reduction of waste from single-use packaging
  - o AB 1509 (Mulling D) Solid waste: lithium-ion batteries
    - No language yet will bring back to the committee
  - o SB 45 (Allen) Wildfire, Drought, and Flood Protection Bond Act of 2020.
    - League staff is still reviewing
  - SB 54 (Allen D) California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act
    - Would enact the California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act, which would establish the policy goal of the state that by 2030 manufacturers and retailers achieve a 75% reduction of waste from single-use packaging
  - SB 200 (Monning) Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund
    - No fees or taxes, just creating the fund

- o SB 205 (Hertzberg) Business Licenses: stormwater discharge compliance.
  - Required to show compliance when you apply for new or renew your business license
  - Requires local jurisdiction to verify compliance with State requirements
- o SB 209 (Dodd D) Wildfire: California Wildfire Warning Center: weather monitoring
  - Would establish in the state government the California Wildlife Warning Center
- o SB 332 (Hertzberg) Wastewater treatment: recycled water.
  - Ocean outflow legislation (revamped from a proposal a few years ago)
  - Local jurisdictions would be required to enforce at their own cost
- o SB 515 (Caballero) California Renewables Portfolio Standard Program: bioenergy renewable feed-in tariff.
  - Concerns were raised about burning biomass instead of putting the biomass in a landfill (but it was also raised that much of the potential biomass will have been contaminated with metals)
  - The League supports this bill.
- o SB 667 (Hueso) Greenhouse gases: recycling infrastructure and facilities.
  - The League supports this bill.
- o SB 669 (Caballero) Water quality: Safe Drinking Water Fund.
  - Instead of a tax, state general fund will assist during years with an increased amount of funds
  - Not sure of general operational costs.

### **Recommendation:**

I request that the Board review this report and topics, and if applicable provide me with any specific policy direction on any of the above topics.

The next Environmental Quality Policy Committee meeting is tentatively scheduled during the LCC Annual Conference on October 16, 2019 in Long Beach. LCC Staff will notify committee members after August 22, 2019 if the policy committee will be meeting in October.
