



 - Enforcement, remittance frequency, review of applicable law





Practical Information to Share with your Governing Body

Governing Body

- Proactive Communication (quarterly or mid-year report) as to legal challenges and the effects on budget
- Support for appeals to legislator

Infrastructure

- Be ready for 5G
- Applicable policy, infrastructure use, current cell leases

Admin/Revenue

- Proactive review of rates and applicable charges (every 5 years)
- Revenue fluctuation and understanding FCC & CPUC rule influence
