

Uptick in trash pickup


The Bureau of Sanitation collected 1 million tons of trash in 2021, a 36,000 ton increase over 2020.

How the American Rescue Plan is Impacting L.A.

About the American Rescue Plan

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) is a \$1.9 trillion bill passed by Congress — signed into law by President Biden on March 11, 2021 — to address the widespread economic and health impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on cities, states, families and individuals.

The package included funding for state and local governments and stimulus checks for individuals, and boosted unemployment insurance, among other things.

Local distribution of ARP funds

The ARP allocated funding to state and local governments across the nation, which had universally seen revenues decline because of the pandemic.

California received \$26 billion in fiscal recovery funds, with another \$16 billion distributed to counties and cities throughout the state, including L.A. County and the City of L.A.
